The mandate of ICAR-CRIDA is:

- (a) To undertake basic and applied research for sustainable and climate resilient agriculture in rainfed areas,
- (b) To Co-ordinate network research for generating location-specific technologies in rainfed areas,
- (c) To serve as a centre for capacity enhancement in natural resource management in drylands.
